Garden Descriptions

Greenberg Garden The Greenberg garden was inspired by the oak woodlands, grasslands, and chaparral of the surrounding valley in Lafayette and the redwood forests of the East Bay hills. The 1.3 acre waterwise garden, now approaching its 30th year, is a tranquil refuge for plants, people, and wildlife.

Fleming Garden Started in the 1950s, Scott and Jenny Fleming's native garden in the Berkeley hills is one of the oldest in the Bay Area. With over 200 species, it has the plants of a collector's garden and the composition of a designer's garden.
